

ABSTRACT

NSF-ATE program officers were interested in widely disseminating the evaluation data collected for the ATE program. Although an overall merged evaluation report could have been produced from the survey and site visit evaluation data, Western Michigan University's (WMU) evaluation project advisory panel, in conjunction with NSF, believed that a more varied and unique approach to report writing should be tried. The intention was to more fully explore the available data through an individual, issue-oriented approach. Toward that end, the WMU evaluation project commissioned the following nine issue papers in early 2001.
